Moravian-Silesian region

1. Where is Moravian-Silesian Region situated? Tell me something about geographical facts - rivers, borders, valleys, mountains and their highest peak,...

The Moravian-Silesian region is located in **the northeastern part** of the Czech Republic. It borders two other countries – Poland to the north and Slovakia to the east.

There are two mountain ranges **Hrubý Jeseník** and **Moravian-Silesian Beskids**. Hrubý Jeseník with the highest mountain (1 492 m) lies on the western border of the region. The mountains have many spectacular places, several ski resorts (Červenohorské Sedlo, Ovčárna) with long-lasting snow cover and **famous spas** such as **Karlova Studánka** and **Jeseník** and they are therefore very popular with tourists.

There are **Moravian-Silesian Beskids** along the borders with Slovakia and Poland. The highest peak is (1 323 m) and (1 129 m) with the statue of Radegast – the pagan god.

Hrubý Jeseník and **Moravian-Silesian Beskids** have wide range of summer and winter recreational facilities for various sports for example swimming, walking, cross country skiing, downhill skiing.

2. What other places of interest can you visit in the region - museums, castles, chateaux, natural beauties?

There are three towns with protected historical centers. is the birthplace of **Sigmund Freud** (a father of psychoanalysis). has a well preserved **central square** with the **Žerotínský chateau** nearby. is a unique small town situated in a valley between lime hills, with many timber houses and the **Trúba Spire** rising on a hill above the town where we can buy so called Štramperk ears which are sweet ginger bread. There is the **Šipka Cave** where Neanderthal child bone remnants were found.

There are many castles and chateaux in the region; the most famous ones are **Hradec nad Moravicí**, **Raduň**, **Kravaře**, **Kroměříž**, **Šilheřovice** and **Fulnek**. **Hukvaldy** is a castle ruin, known for a musical festival dedicated to the composer **Leoš Janáček**, who was born there. Another well-known castle ruin is **Sovinec**.

Due to the importance of industry in the region, there are many museums displaying products of local technical development: **The Automobile Museum in Kopřivnice** exhibits the history Tatra, the **Train Car Museum in Studénka**, the **Mining Museum** and the former **Michal Mine (Důl Michal)** in Ostrava.

Ostrava offers also many interesting places, such as Silesian-Ostrava castle, Stodolni Street, which is well-known in Europe, the National Moravian-Silesian theatre or the tower of the new city hall.

Golf lovers can play it in **Šilheřovice** or **Čeladná**. Families can visit zoos in Ostrava and Olomouc.

People can be treated in many spas; the most famous are **Karlova Studánka**, **Klimkovice** or **Priessnitz Spa Health Centre** in Jeseník which offers the world-famous hydrotherapy.

Walachian Open-Air Museum is found in Rožnov pod Radhoštěm. There are lots of wooden buildings, also church and pub. Festivals as Christmas or Easter are celebrated here in traditional way.

The Silesian Museum in Opava is the oldest museum of its kind in the Czech Republic with a collection fund of more than 1,600,000 objects from the natural and social sciences mostly from Silesia. It is the third richest and most valuable collection in the Czech Republic.

The Monument of the Second World War in **Hrabyně** is located next to the main road to Ostrava.

The town **Velké Losiny** offers **hand-made paper mill factory** and the **museum of paper**, chateau, spa and thermal swimming and indoor pool.

Sports facilities are situated mostly in Ostrava, Jeseníky and Beskydy Mountains. There are lots of football stadiums, ice rinks, tennis courts, swimming pools, winter resorts and water parks.

5. What are the industrial branches in the region and what is grown and bred there?

Moravian-Silesian Region is known for its heavy industry, metallurgical production, coal mining, production of iron, textile, chemical, machinery, automobile, clothes, food and glass industry. The biggest international factory is Arcelor Mittal which produces iron, other big companies are OKD, Třinecké železárny, Dalkia or Vítkovice Holding.

There are a lot of natural resources for example coal, lead, zinc, copper, natural gas. People grow wheat, barley, potatoes, hop, fruit, vegetables and breed several animals, poultry, pigs, sheep, beef.

6. What means of transport can you use and describe the infrastructure?

People can travel by car, taxi or use public transport for example: buses, trams, trolley-buses, trains, coaches; air transport because Ostrava has an international airport in Mošnov and a new motorway which connects Ostrava with other big cities.
