

**Broadsheets** are quality papers, larger in size, with few black and white pictures. The text is serious, reliable and unemotional.

**Tabloids** are smaller in size, they have shorter texts with many coloured pictures, and there are large headlines that tell the whole story.

The most frequent quality papers are The Times, The Daily Telegraph, The Guardian, The Independent. The most frequent tabloids are The Daily Mirror, The Sun, The People.

TV brings entertainment, relaxation and education. The Czech Republic has two public service stations - ČT1, ČT2 and two commercial stations - Nova, Prima.

The British channels are BBC1 which shows programme of general interest like sport or current affairs, BBC2 shows documentaries, travel programmes, serious drama, music and foreign films. There are commercial stations: ITV, Channel 4 and Channel 5. If people pay extra, they can have a satellite dish or cable TV and receive more channels.
