Note:

There is a lot of food/ money/ coffee etc. (singular verb)

There are a lot of trees/ shops/ people etc. (plural verb)

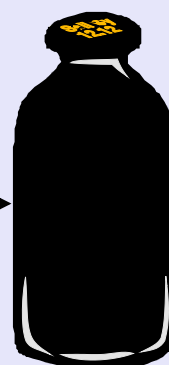
A lot of people speak English. (not 'A lot of people speaks')

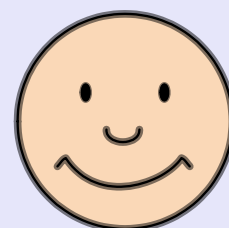

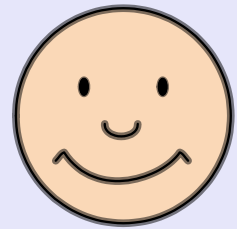
