Nunavut

Nunavut is the largest, northernmost and newest territory of Canada. It was separated officially from the Northwest Territories on April 1, 1999. The capital Iqaluit (formerly "Frobisher Bay") on Baffin Island, in the east, was chosen by the 1995 capital plebiscite.

Some of the inhabitants still keep their traditional lifestyle – They live in igloos and earn their living by fishing and hunting. Many areas are rich in wildlife such as the Arctic fox, fur seals, barren-ground caribou, Arctic char and musk ox.

Nunavut is both the least populous and the largest in area of the provinces and territories of Canada. One of the most remote, sparsely settled regions in the world, it has a population of 31,906,^[3] mostly Inuit, spread over land area the size of Western Europe, Mexico or Indonesia. The population density is 0.015 persons per square kilometre, one of the lowest in the world.

The flag features a red inuksuk—an Inuit land marker—and a blue star, which represents the *Niqirtsuituq*, the North Star, and the leadership of elders in the community. The colours represent the riches of the land, sea and sky.
